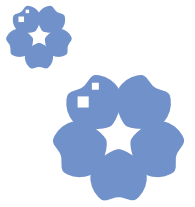


# DigiDementia

## Short Summary

The DigiDementia project aims to raise awareness of dementia and strengthen the skills of both professional and informal carers. It supports care-facilities staff as well as family members, helping them better understand the disease and provide more effective care to loved ones. By fostering knowledge and capacity, DigiDementia contributes to the creation of a more targeted and sustainable dementia-care strategy and ensures high-quality, long-term support for people living with dementia.

## Objectives

Enhance dementia-friendly initiatives for older-age caregivers: reduce stigma around dementia and promote targeted dementia-care practices.

Provide support to people with dementia and their families, helping them deal with the condition more confidently.

Introduce digital practices (including AI-enabled tools) to slow the progression of dementia and improve care delivery.



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## Who Will Benefit

### People living with dementia:

improved quality of care, digital support tools, more tailored care practices.

### Family members and informal caregivers:

better understanding of dementia, guidance, training, peer-support opportunities.

### Professional caregivers and staff in care-facilities:

upskilling in dementia-care, digital methods, and more effective, modern practice.

### Care-facilities and organisation in dementia-care:

access to digital models, training curricula, platforms to adopt and scale good practice.

### Policy-makers and stakeholders in elder-care / health-care sectors:

new evidence base, resources, digital model to inform strategy and improve services.



## Project Output

### The project will deliver a number of concrete outputs:

- 1 A Report mapping proven and effective dementia-care methods in participating countries, with emphasis on digital tools (including AI-based) for dementia-care.
- 2 A Web Platform (AI-enabled) which will contain the digitised care methods identified in the Report, and include a chatbot/forum for sharing experiences among caregivers, informal carers and persons with dementia; this platform will be pilot-tested with selected social service providers.
- 3 A new educational Curriculum for dementia-care professionals / informal carers, which will also be pilot-tested.
- 4 An Online Educational Programme based on the curriculum and digitised methods, enabling flexible training and up-skilling of caregivers and family/informal carers.
